Prayer Square With Cross

Size: approx. 5 inches Knitting needle size: 6

Yarn weight: (3) Sport weight

Abbreviations: K-knit P-purl

Cast on 25 stitches.

Row 1: K across

Row 2: K across

Row 3: K across

Row 4: K across (Right side)

Row 5: K3, P19, K3

Row 6: K across

Row 7: K3, P8, K3, P8, K3

Row 8: K across

Row 9: K3, P8, K3, P8, K3

Row 10: K across

Row 11: K3, P8, K3, P8, K3

Row 12: K across

Row 13: K3, P8, K3, P8, K3

Row 14: K across

Row 15: K3, P8, K3, P8, K3

Row 16: K across

Row 17: K3, P8, K3, P8, K3

Row 18: K across

Row 19: K3, P3, K13, P3, K3

Row 20: K across

Row 21: K3, P3, K13, P3, K3

Row 22: K across

Row 23: K3, P3, K13, P3, K3

Row 24: K across

Row 25: K3, P8, K3, P8, K3

Row 26: K across

Row 27: K3, P8, K3, P8, K3

Row 28: K across

Row 29: K3, P8, K3, P8, K3

Row 30: K across

Row 31: K3, P19, K3

Row 32: K across

Row 33: K across


Row 34: K across

Row 35: K across

Bind off. Weave ends in. Block.

PATTERN: Prayer Squares From Lily at My Hobby Shop

About a year ago I crocheted a few prayer squares and donated it to a fellow CreateCrochet team member. She then sold them at a Relay for Life event to raise money. The items that she did not sell were donated to a local hospital.



Prayer Squares

This is a fantastic way to use up your scrap yarn. Have fun with combining colors. If you make enough squares you can attach them to make a scrap happy afghan.

The idea behind these squares is that the person making them is praying while working on them. So the person receiving the square can be touched and blessed by your prayers.

Materials:

Small amount of worsted weight yarn

Crochet Hook Size 5 (H) - or whatever size your comfortable with

Abbreviations/Special Stitches:

Hook = HK

Chain = CH

Stitch = ST

Single Crochet = SC

Puff Stitch = PS: YO, insert hook in next stitch, yo, pull through and bring yarn up to height of rest of stitches (3 loops on hook), YO, insert hook in SAME stitch, yo, pull through and bring yarn up to height of rest of stitches (5 loops on hook), YO, insert hook once again into the SAME stitch, yo, pull through and bring yarn up to height of rest of stitches (7 loops on hook), yo and pull through all loops on the hook.

Instructions:

Chain 12

Row 1: sc in second ch from hk and in each ch across. ch 1, turn (11sc)

Row 2: sc in each of next 5 sc, puff st in next sc, sc in each of next 5 sc, ch 1, turn

Row 3: sc across, ch 1, turn

Row 4-9: repeat rows 2 &3

Row 10: sc in 1st sc, *puff st in next sc, sc in next sc*, repeat to end

Row 11: sc across, ch 1, turn Row 12-14: repeat rows 2 & 3

Row 15: sc in each sc across

Once your square is done you can use a single crochet stitch around to create a neat border.
